

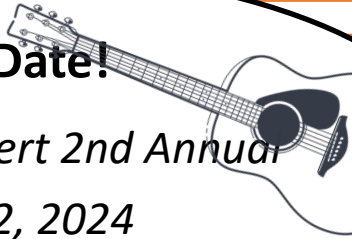

*It has been a very full year and we appreciate you being right there with us with your generous support!*

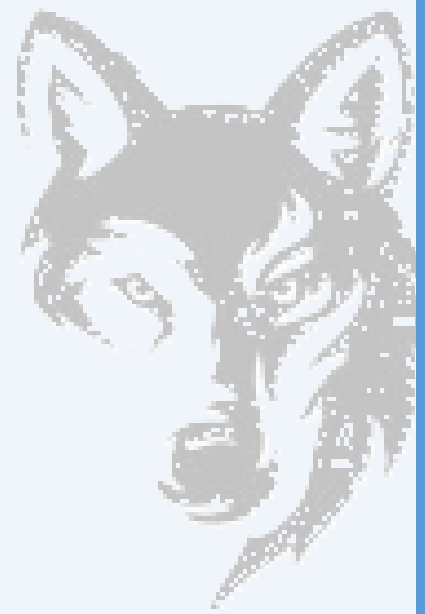
- An abrupt move! A wonderful new partnership with Millwood Presbyterian Community Church. Thank you!
- We produced two successful fundraising events and raised \$130,000 to support Project id and our member programs.
- We have been joined by more than 100 new members this year.

## *Our Successes.....*

- Serving almost 200 people per day in the Wolf Den and other community activities. Serving 500 members each month.
- Community Inclusion partnerships:
- Meals on Wheels a: we delivered more than 162 meals. Per month.
- Teen and Kid Closet: pickup and drop off of clothing from collection centers.
- Salvation Army: merchandise display cleanup in two locations.
- Feed Spokane: sort food for community sharing.
- Fig Tree: delivery of newsletter and community service packs.

Ten years ago, Project ID was conceived by parents who observed their child aging out of high school and losing connections with many crucial aspects of life vital to her well-being. They were worried about what she would do as an adult and as someone with an intellectual disability, as there were limited programs to support her after high school.
